AB Interdisciplinary Art and Design

- Basic foundation, broad study of music or art
- More elective hours for students pursuing other majors, minors or certificate programs



Declaring a Fine Arts Major

- Music and Dance majors **must audition** and be accepted
- Art majors can declare “Intended Art”

Major-appropriate music, art, and dance classes are **restricted to declared majors.**

- Little time to pursue double major/pre-med/minors



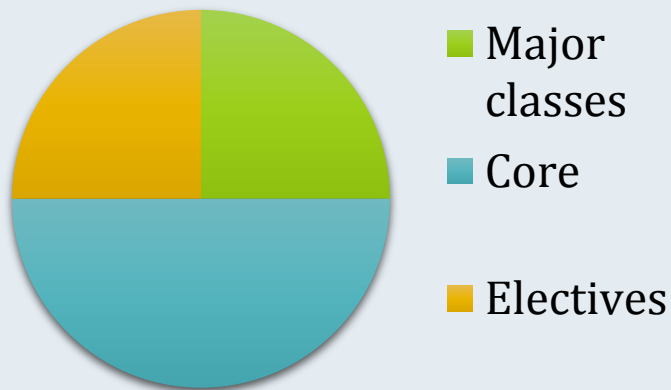

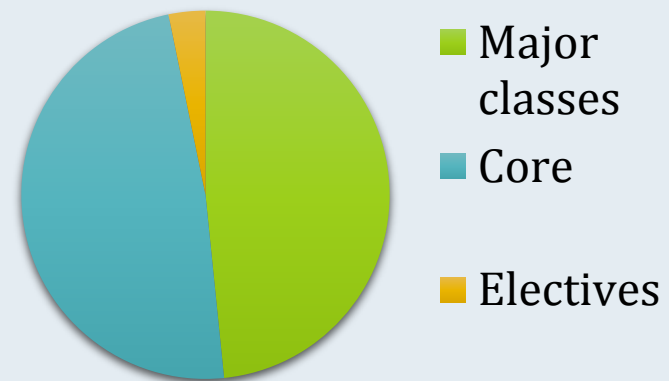

Core Area	What's in it?
AREA I	English 1101 and 1102 and MATH 1101
AREA II	Life Science and Physical Science (one lab)
AREA III	MATH, CSCI, STAT (or other options)
AREA IV	Foreign language (if required) and World Culture classes One Humanities class (literature for some)
AREA V	US History, Political Science, and another Social Science
AREA VI	Music, Dance or Art Classes



Franklin College Requirements

Required:

- AB Music and Art
- Music Performance
- Music Composition
- Music Theory

Not Required:

- BFA Art & Dance
- Music Education
- Music Therapy

All Majors require a Multicultural course



Franklin College Requirements

FC Requirement	What is this?
Foreign language	One language through the third semester of knowledge
Literature	A literature class beyond ENGL 1101 and 1102
Fine arts, Philosophy, or Religion	You will have these courses within your fine arts major
Social science	Two social science courses from <u>two different</u> departments
History	US History
Multicultural	Diversity in the United States (African-American, Native-American, etc.)

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Two GPA's for Transfers

Overall GPA

Coursework from all schools

Cumulative or UGA GPA

Coursework from UGA

Must earn a 2.0 at UGA to be in good standing at UGA.

Art majors must maintain a 2.5 overall GPA.

Important for Transfers

- At least **121** Hours required to graduate
- **39** of the 121 hours must be upper-level (3000+)
- **45** of your last **60** hours must be completed in residence at UGA
- **Department's discretion** whether to allow upper division transfer courses to count towards the major



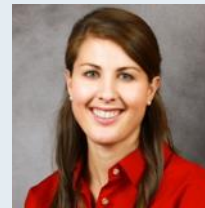
