
Understanding Credit Hours

120 academic hours + PE




What Is in 120 Hours?

Electives: ~ 32-20 hours




How to Graduate in Four Years





Requirement	
Foreign language	One language through the third semester
Literature	A literature class beyond ENGL 1101 and 1102
Fine arts, Philosophy, or Religion	Two courses in APPRECIATION or history of the arts and/or philosophy and/or religion
Social science	Two social science courses from <i>two different</i> departments
History	History
Multicultural	Diversity in the United States (African-American, Native-American, etc.)

Cultural Diversity	Diversity around the World



Your Fall Schedule




